The North Africa Geology Forum

First, welcome to the North Africa Geology Forum.

The NAGF is a new discussion group founded for the IGCP 485 project entitled "Cratons, metacratons and mobile belts: keys from the West African craton boundaries Eburnian versus Pan-African signature, magmatic, tectonic and metallogenic implications".

Our initial aim for the forum is to promote links between geologists working in the Palaeoproterozoic and Neoproterozoic terranes around the West African Craton. We hope the NAGF will become a platform to foster new ideas and research into the relation between the Palaeoproterozoic and the Neoproterozoic orogenies in North Africa. Basically, the focused areas are, clockwise from west to east: Mauritanides (Senegal, Mauritania), Anti-Atlas (Morocco), Ougarta (Algeria), Tuareg shield (Algeria, Niger, Mali), Gourma (Mali, Niger). Rockelides and Dahomeides are also areas of close interest to the forum.

Although our current remit is focused on the Palaeoproterozoic and Neoproterozoic of Northwestern Africa, if a general demand arises, the discussion may be widened to include other areas important to the North African research community.

All comments, discussions, questions concerning the above scientific subject are welcome, whether it is of general or of local interest, at a student or senior level, academic or applied. Messages can be sent in English or in French.
